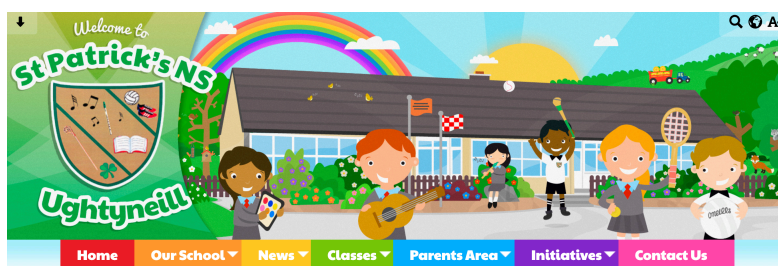


Easter Newsletter

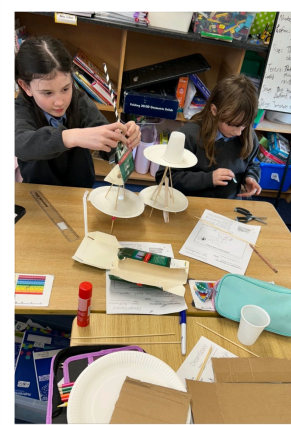


super - we had everyone from Paddington to Gangsta Granny alongside Footballers and Vampires! It was lovely to see so many children excited about books.
